


TKA Summer Reading

Dear Parents of Rising 4th Grade Students,

As a school, we have seen some awesome benefits of our summer reading program. Statistics tell us how very important it is for students to keep up their reading and writing skills over the summer. It is our goal at TKA for our students to come back refreshed from summer break, but also on track and ready to jump back into learning. Fourth grade students will read 1 book. They will need to choose a book from the following list. Each student needs to choose a book that he/she has not read before. After reading the book, the student will answer the questions on the attached sheet. This paper is to be turned in on the **first day of school**. Teachers will count this report as a quiz grade in reading for the first nine weeks of the next school year. Please make sure that the report is written neatly **in cursive** handwriting. Students need to write **in complete sentences** that are grammatically correct. In the fall, students will also have the option of taking the AR test that accompanies the book he/she read from the list, but they are not required to do so. Teachers will use this report as a gauge to see how well the students comprehended the story they read.
