Directions: You need to create a book cover and book review for each of the books you read. Follow the directions below. Each paragraph should be 6-10 sentences.

- Book Cover: Create a book cover by hand or by computer that depicts what the book is about. Staple it to your book review.
- Summary Paragraph: Include the following
 - Title and author of the book
 - Setting (time & place)
 - Characters (main characters; who is the main character; who is the villain)
 - Main events (5-8 main events in the story)
 - Turning point (What event changed the course of the story?)
 - Resolution (How did the story end?)
- · Evaluation Paragraph: Include the following
 - O What did you like about the story or characters?
 - O What did you not like about the story or characters?
 - O What would you change in the story to make it better? Why?
 - Did this book mention God or Christianity in any way? If so, how did the author portray God or Christianity? (positively or negatively)
 - O Would you recommend this book to someone else? Why?
