

The King's Academy Discovery Program Alternative Graduation Routes

For students participating in the Discovery Program for educational therapy, the option is available to select a graduation track which best meets the student's learning needs. In addition to the regular College Preparatory Diploma offered by TKA, there is also the opportunity for either a General Diploma or a Certificate of Graduation.

1. General Diploma (SCISA approved)

English	4 units
Math	4 units
Science	3 units
Social Science	3 units
Bible	4 units
Fine Arts	1 unit
Computer	1 unit
PE/Health	1 unit
Electives	4 units (Discovery – 1 unit per year)
Foreign Language	1 unit*

- A unit of a foreign language may be substituted with one the following units:
 - 1 unit of Science
 - 1 unit of Social Studies

2. Students who require 1-1 instruction in a particular course (after at least 1 quarter in a regular class) will be allowed to take the course under a different arrangement.

- a. must be taught by an instructor acceptable to school administration
- b. may be granted accommodations/modifications in accord with learning difference
- c. modifications to course requirements will be noted in transcript
- d. time and place must be arranged with Discovery director; may be during school hours and on campus if space and schedule allow
- e. cost for additional curriculum/resources will be responsibility of parent
- f. fees for private instruction will be the responsibility of parent

3. Students who require additional instruction to successfully complete a particular course may receive tutoring by a Discovery Program instructor, tutor, or student tutor.

- a. may be during the school day if schedules and space allow
- b. cost for additional curriculum/resources will be the responsibility of the parent
- c. an additional fee will be charged for tutoring
- d. curriculum modifications may be up to 50% in a particular course
- e. modifications to course requirements will be noted in transcript
- f. curriculum accommodations will be made in accord with individual student's needs.

4. Students who require a different academic program (ie. remedial math or English), restructuring of yearly requirements (ie. one year of courses completed in two years, or repetition of a course, not due to failure but to work on solidifying foundational concepts)

must meet basic requirements agreed upon by TKA Administration, Discovery Director, and parents. If a student is unable to meet the requirements for a General Diploma, a **Certificate of Graduation** (indicating that he/she has completed four years of academic study) may be awarded.
